information on the admission test.

The admission test for all Bachelor's degree programs takes approximately 80 minutes and is conducted online. The admission test consists of four sections focused on logical and deductive reasoning, numerical skills, English language skills, and personality factors relevant to studying skills.

l admission test procedure.

We will provide you with a time frame for the test in the course of the application process, in which you can determine a time slot that suits you. You will receive detailed information and the link to the admission test in a timely manner by a separate e-mail.

The exam takes approximately 80 minutes; there are no breaks allowed. Instructions are provided throughout the exam to help applicants are guided through each section. The exam is to be taken independently in a quiet room without distractions. No aids of any kind are to be used during the exam.

2 admission test sections.

At the beginning of each section, a practice example is provided. The test questions are adaptive, i.e., the level of difficulty of the questions is based on the extent to which the previous questions were answered correctly. Therefore, the questions might become increasingly difficult if you answer them successfully.


The online admission test consists of the following test sections:

• FIGURAL INDUCTIVE REASONING

This section is to test your ability to recognize the general rules on which individual questions are founded. This ability helps you to acquire new competences and recognize interconnections between different disciplines.


This set of questions is about being able to identify rules. You will be presented with a table of three rows and three columns containing altogether eight figures. These are arranged according to different rules. Your task will be to identify these rules and determine the ninth figure in each question.






• MATHEMATICAL FLEXIBILITY

Questions in this category will require you to determine the arithmetic operation (addition, subtraction, multiplication or division) to be applied to obtain a correct result. You will have to consider the order of operations, i.e. multiplication and division first, and then addition and subtraction, in order to be able to replace the question marks with the correct operations.



• VERBAL FLUENCY

In this section, an unordered series of letters is to be transformed in a meaningful noun.
