Professor Harris received his B.A. degree in Asian Studies from Cornell University in 1973, and received his J.D. degree with high honors from the University of North Carolina School of Law in 1981. At UNC, he teaches courses on comparative health systems, health law, and global perspectives on ethical issues.

Professor Harris is the author of *Contemporary Issues in Healthcare Law and Ethics*, (4th edition), which was published by Health Administration Press in 2014, and *Ethics in Health Services and Policy: A Global Approach*, which was published by Jossey-Bass/John Wiley & Sons, Inc., in 2011. He frequently travels to Europe and Asia to give lectures and seminars.

In addition, Professor Harris is a licensed attorney. He practiced law from 1981 to 1999, with a primary focus on representation of health care organizations and providers. In his work in the health care field, he has provided legal advice and representation in areas such as anti-trust, certificate of need and other regulatory matters, mergers and acquisitions, joint ventures and corporate reorganization, medical staff membership and clinical privileges, Medicare and Medicaid, professional licensure, and patient care issues.
