INTERPOL is the world's largest international police organization, with 190 member countries. The role is to enable police around the world to work together to make the world a safer place. The high-tech infrastructure of technical and operational support helps meet the growing challenges of fighting crime in the 21st century.

The INTERPOL Global Complex for Innovation (IGCI) in Singapore is a research and development facility for the identification of crimes and criminals and provides innovative training and operational support for law enforcement across the globe. Mr Nakatani oversees and coordinates the creation and development of the programs and services that will be delivered from the IGCI by INTERPOL to its 190 member countries.

Mr Nakatani holds the rank of Commissioner at the National Police Agency (NPA) of Japan. Prior to his secondment to INTERPOL, Mr Nakatani was Special Advisor to the Commissioner General of the NPA of Japan and Director of the Transnational Organized Crime Office (2011), where he was in charge of supervising major transnational organized crime investigations as well as the formulation of strategic priorities at the national level.

Mr Nakatani was also the Senior Assistant Director for Cyber Crime Division of the NPA (2004-2007). His work in this position included responsibility for policy and planning in the area of cybercrime across the nation. Mr Nakatani joined the NPA as a fast-track officer in April 1993, and has held various posts, such as the Executive Officer to the Minister of State and the Chairperson of the National Public Safety Commission (2001–2002).
